

Ride Care Points

Please note that this is not a race

The aim of the ride is for cyclists to have an enjoyable day out whilst at the same time making a valuable contribution to **this years chosen charity**.

The route has been kept to minor roads wherever possible; however, all riders must bear in mind that the ride is on public roads so:

PLEASE BE AWARE OF OTHER ROAD USERS

If arriving by car, you should be able to park in front of the Stokesley Town Hall but if not then please find a suitable place.

In order to assist the organisers and to make sure that **all riders** are accounted for, cyclists are to **confirm** their name and number at the **start check-in point, Clay Bank** car park, the **Dog & Gunn** refreshment points and at the **finish**.

There will be Marshal's or directional route arrows at most junctions and a back-up car / Motor Cyclists to assist any rider(s) that may require assistance.

(The car / Motor Cyclists will be following riders on the route)

Some places where **care must be taken** are:

🚲 A172 / A173 to Great Ayton

🚲 Right turn at the Buck Inn, Great Ayton

🚲 Ingleby Bank to Clay Bank Car Park refreshment stop. This is a **steep** bank and the road is quite narrow in places – many cyclists may have to dismount and push their bikes at this point, if so, **please keep to the left**.

🚲 Clay Bank car park to Great Broughton – this is a long descent and there may be a tendency to go too fast – **take care**, keep to the left and ensure that your brakes are in good working order!!!

🚲 Crossing the A172 from Faceby to Goulton Lane. This is a main road and traffic will be travelling quickly. **Cross with care**.

🚲 Hutton Rudby and Stokesley may be quite busy by the time you arrive,

all cyclists should take care.
